Lowcountry Orphan Relief receives the Gift of Reading

Over 100 educational children's books were donated to Lowcountry Orphan Relief libraries in two Charleston county boys homes, thanks to the Charleston Lowcountry Civitan Org. and EDC, Usborne Books **Literacy for a Lifetime** matching grant program.
